Divisions: Upper Primary P.4 - 6 (~Ages 10-12)

Lower Secondary S. 1 - 3 (~Ages 13-15)

Upper Secondary S. 4 -6 (~Ages 16-18)

The division will be governed by the grade in school instead

of age. For example, if you are age 16 and studying in S.3, you

will be in the Lower Secondary division

Team Cap: 36 teams per division, first-come, first-served.

Max. 4 teams per school (8 participants). Any additional

candidates will be waitlisted, and the result will be announced

after the registration deadline.

Break: 1. Open and 2. Novice

Break categories will be determined by the responses

provided on the application form, at the sole discretion of the

Adjudication Committee.










COMPETITION FORMAT





Currently at its fourth iteration, the IPDC is an international debate competition that will involve delegates from all over the world, including the Greater Bay Area and the Belt and Road Regions. This online event is an exciting opportunity for young learners to compete and meet with peers where physical interactions are limited.

The 4th IPDC is also one of the only Asia-based competitions which runs on the Modified American Parliamentary Debate format! The tournament features three categories: Upper Primary, Lower Secondary, and Upper Secondary. We welcome everyone, whether a beginner or experienced debater to participate in this event.

This year, we have two separate break categories: **Open and Novice**. This will ensure greater inclusivity and allow debaters with different skill levels to compete with each other.

Competition Dates

January 28 (Saturday) and

January 29 (Sunday), 2023

Team Cap

36 per division, first-come, first-served

2 students per team

Competition Format

Modified American Parliamentary Debate

- 2 speakers per team, with the 1st speaker also making the rebuttal speech
- Motions are released on the competition day, and debaters can prepare within a given time

Speaker Time

*No Points of Information (POI) will be allowed

- 15 minutes prep time (20 minutes during the first round)
 with your partner in the breakout room
- First Proposition Speech: 4 min
- First Opposition Speech: 5 min
- Second Proposition Speech: 5 min
- Second Opposition Speech: 5 min
- Opposition Rebuttal: 3 min
- Proposition Rebuttal: 4 min

There is a 30 second grace period between the transition of each speaker.

Judge Rule: n-3

(where n is the number of teams) For example, if you are sending 3 teams, (3-3 = 0), you do not need to send a judge. If you send 4 teams (4-3=1), you will need to send 1 judge.

Each <u>school</u> sending 4 teams or more is required to send at least one judge. If you require an exemption to this rule, or if you would like to volunteer as a judge by sending 3 teams or less, please contact us.

This rule does not apply to <u>individual</u> teams.

A one-off briefing for teachers and students will be held after the registration period in order to introduce participants and coaches to the competition format as well as answer any questions.

Online Workshop

Schools that nominate at least four participants to enter will be offered a complimentary online workshop on a first-come, first-served basis. Led by our top coaches who are all former debaters and national champions from top US Ivy League Universities, Oxford and Cambridge, these preparatory workshops will familiarize participants with the format of the Competition and have a practice round. Workshops will generally be held during weekends (e.g. Saturday or Sunday mornings) to avoid overlapping with school hours.

The number of workshop participants will be capped at 20 and will include a mix of schools. For schools looking for private training, please contact See Change Education for details.

For open teams who are looking for training, we offer paid training camps over Christmas and Chinese New Year. Please contact See Change Education for more details.
