








COMPETITION FORMAT





Currently, in its fifth iteration, the IPDC is an international debate competition that will involve delegates from all over the world, including the Greater Bay Area and the Belt and Road Regions. This online event is an exciting opportunity for young learners to compete and meet with peers across the globe.

The 5th IPDC is also one of the only Asia-based competitions that run on the Modified American Parliamentary Debate format! The tournament features three categories: Upper Primary, Middle School, and High School Secondary. We welcome everyone, whether a beginner or experienced debater to participate in this event.

This year, we have two separate break categories: Open and Novice. This will ensure greater inclusivity and allow debaters with different skill levels to compete with each other.

Competition Format

Modified American Parliamentary Debate

- 2 speakers per team, with the 1st speaker also making the rebuttal speech
- Motions are released on the competition day, and debaters can prepare within a given time
- 30 minutes preparation time
- Only the Open Division of Lower & Upper Secondary streams will have POIs. - Upper Primary stream and Lower & Upper Secondary Novice Divisions have no POIs.

• There is a 30 second grace period between the transition of each speaker.

Judge Rule:

If you are registering more than three teams for a stream, you must supply one judge for that stream. The judge has to pass the judge test to be accepted to judge on your behalf.

Schools/organizations that fail to meet this provision will have to pay a judge compensation fee of 80 USD.

If you have more than 3 teams in different streams, then you must provide a judge for each of the streams, or pay a judge compensation fee for each stream you are unable to do so for.

NEW CHANGES IN IPDC

- 1. For all organizations/institutions/schools (from all branches combined), you only have 4 teams max per division (collectively for both beginner and advanced segments within the stream).
- 2. The decision of a judge for a round is final and incontestable.
- 3.The Lower and Upper Secondary streams will have POIs. Upper Primary stream will have no POIs.
- 4.The Lower and Upper Secondary streams' speaking time will be 1 minute longer for all speeches compared to the Upper Primary streams.
- 5. All debates will now have 30 minutes of preparation time.
- 6. The use of online research and Chat GPT/Poe during the competition is prohibited.
- 7. If you are registering more than three teams for a stream, you must supply one judge for that stream. The judge has to pass the judge test to be accepted to judge on your behalf. Schools/organizations that fail to meet this provision will have to pay a judge compensation fee of 80 USD. If you have more than 3 teams in different streams, then you must provide a judge for each of the streams, or pay a judge compensation fee for each stream you are unable to do so for.
- 8.All debaters will be required to keep their video cameras open throughout every debate round.

Online Bootcamps and Workshop

Free complimentary online workshops will be offered by our top coaches who are all former debaters and national champions from top US Ivy League Universities, Oxford and Cambridge, these preparatory workshops will familiarize participants with the format of the Competition and have a practice round. Workshops will generally be held during weekends (e.g. Saturday or Sunday mornings) to avoid overlapping with school hours.
