








COMPETITION FORMAT





Currently at its third iteration, the IPDC is an international debate competition and will involve delegates from all over the world, including the Greater Bay Area and the Belt and Road Regions. This online event is an exciting opportunity for young people to compete and meet with peers from around the world at a time where physical interactions are limited.

The 3rd IPDC is also one of the only Asia-based competitions which runs on the Modified American Parliamentary Debate format! The tournament features three categories: Upper Primary, Middle School, and High School Secondary and everyone, whether a beginner or experienced debater - is welcome to participate.

This year, we have two separate break categories: **novice and open break**. This will ensure more inclusivity and allow debaters of different skill levels to meet each other and battle it out!

Team Cap

36 per division, first come first served

2 students per team

Competition Format

Modified American Parliamentary Debate

- 2 speakers per team, with the 1st speaker also making the rebuttal speech
- Motions are released on the day of the debate, and debaters are given time to prepare beforehand

Speaker Time

*No Points of Information (POI) will be allowed

- 15 minutes prep time (20 minutes during the first round)
 with your partner in the breakout room
- First Proposition Speech: 4 min
- First Opposition Speech: 5 min
- Second Proposition Speech: 5 min
- Second Opposition Speech: 5 min
- Opposition Rebuttal: 3 min
- Proposition Rebuttal: 4 min

There is a 30 second grace period between the transition of each speaker.

Judge Rule: n-3

(where n is the number of teams) For example, if you are sending 3 teams, (3-3 = 0), you do not need to send a judge. If you send 4 teams (4-3=1), you will need to send 1 judge.

Each <u>school</u> sending 4 teams or more is required to send at least one judge. If you require an exemption to this rule, or if you would like to volunteer as a judge if your school is sending 3 teams or less, please contact us.

This rule does not apply to individual teams.

Briefing

A one-off briefing for teachers and students will be held after the registration period in order to introduce participants and coaches to the competition format as well as answer any questions.

Bootcamps

Schools that nominate at least four participants to entry will be offered a complimentary online bootcamp on a first-come-first served basis. Led by our top coaches who are all former debaters and national champions from top US Ivy League Universities, Oxford and Cambridge, these preparatory workshops will familiarize participants with the format of the Competition and to have a practice round. Sessions will generally be held during weekends (e.g. Saturday or Sunday mornings) to avoid overlap with school hours.

The number of bootcamp participants will be capped at 25, and will include a mix of schools. For schools looking for private training, please contact See Change Education for details.

For open teams who are looking for training, we offer paid training camps over Christmas and Chinese New Year. Please contact See Change Education for more details.

REGISTRATION & PAYMENT

Stage 1 - Registration

Stage 1 registration is the main application process. Teams shall submit their information through the Google form on the IPDC website.

Stage 1 Deadline: 7th January 2022 (Friday) (Extended)

Stage 2 - Confirmation and Payment

After Stage 1, confirmation emails will be sent to teams along with details for payment. A team is confirmed upon completion of payment in accordance with the payment details in the email.

Stage 2 Deadline: 14th January 2021 (Friday)

Stage 3 - Waitlist Registration

Stage 3 opens only if there are spaces left after the conclusion of Stage 1 and 2. Schools wishing to send more than 8 students (4 teams) may register their additional teams at this stage.
